HELEN CLARK TO WHA: "DON'T TAKE TOO LONG" IN NEGOTIATING PANDEMIC INSTRUMENT

23 November | Devex | Countries need to work faster in implementing the recommendations of the Independent Panel for Pandemic Preparedness and Response, such as in negotiating a new legal instrument for pandemic preparedness and response, Helen Clark has said.

"Some things are happening, but they're not happening fast enough," Clark, former panel co-chair, said Monday during a Chatham House-hosted event as the panel launched its latest report tracking progress against its recommendations published in May 2021. "We need end-to-end solutions which can get these goods out to where they are needed in a timely fashion," she added.
